<u>Image Files</u>: RGB mode (even for monochrome images). In the sRGB colour space. In JPEG format. Saving at not less than quality 10 (80%) is sufficient. Maximum image dimensions are 1600 pixels horizontal by 1200 pixels vertical. Less than 2MB per image.

Not sure what all this means – Please speak at WPC meeting for guidance.




Figure 2 Looking South – Image Paul Burdon from Facebook




Figure 3 Looking at you looking at us – Image Alan Wilson




Figure 4 Our host Sean -Image Alan Wilson

Kevin Morgan then took us to North East locations, some popular spots, but also other less obvious locations. A view taken from behind waterfalls was intriguing and instructive with how different camera


setting obtained different effects being discussed. A St Nicholas Cathedral image allowed introduction of our work with CGiSS and other WPC Exhibitions and initiatives.

After Tea, Carol took us on a grand and colourful world tour prior to concentrating on some local flower scenes including a short Audio-Visual piece. An AV first for Carol.


The evening was wrapped-up with Alan Wilson and a short Safari of Africa and its wildlife.

Well done all. A selection of images – coming just like the animals 2-by-2 from AP: KM: CS: AW.




Passing of David Shaw - Sunderland PA
